The picture below shows the 2023 Escuela de Misiones de la Amazonia students with their mentors and teachers ready to head to various indigenous communities along the Amazon River. They left the first week of June for their month of ministry practicum following the first semester of training. Upon their return, they joyfully reported that each



community allowed them freedom to visit door-to-door and hold children, youth, and adult activities and services. We praise God for the open doors and the receptive hearts. Plans are being made with area indigenous pastors to continue visiting these communities to establish churches that will make disciples who make disciples.

In July, we went with our local church to the southern border on a learn/serve trip with Border Perspective Ministry. We got a hands-on, up-close and personal education and we wrestled with questions like, What does God say about the sojourner?



What response does He expect of us to their needs? If you want to know more, ask us how He made the weeks' lessons tangible at the airport.



It's really easy to get caught up in construction at the Farm. It's exciting to see buildings go up, but the farm and the buildings are a "means to an end"- that of connecting and equipping Christfollowers cross-culturally to advance His Kingdom and make Him known in all the world.

What do we need to get this done?

- 1) A farm developer / business director. The farm is a diamond in the rough. We need someone to bring out her beauty. Do you know someone? Are you that someone?
 - 2) Finances for the next phase of construction. We need a dorm before next year's classes start. It will cost about \$80K.
 - 3) Partners investing in workers like Rolando. He graduated two years ago and has been serving in a local church, but he's called

and trained to be a missionary. Who will send him? How will he go? He needs prayer, encouragement, finances.

> 4) Team members - From November to February we need 2-3 work teams for construction and agriculture work. How about you? Your church? Your family?
